# **20 YEARS OF IMPACT** A CONVERSATION WITH BECKY CLINGMAN

Sara: What motivated you to start the Augustine Literacy Project® of Winston-Salem 20 years ago?

Becky: As a teacher, I taught wherever my husband's job with the Army took us. I was always concerned about why some of my students, who seemed bright, had difficulty reading. I did a lot of research and began to learn about dyslexia.

I believed this was extremely important because so many students can't learn to read otherwise. It became a passion. When we discovered that one of our "very

bright" sons had dyslexia it became even more important.

As my children grew older, I had been thinking about a volunteer project for several years, and the Chapel Hill Augustine Literacy Project® provided a catalyst for me to do something.

Sara: What are you most proud of about the organization's accomplishments over the last 20 years?

Becky: Transforming the Augustine Literacy Project® into Read Write Spell, which allowed training for classroom teachers. It was a major step forward that helped teachers reach struggling students.

Sara: How do our volunteers, board members, donors play a role in this accomplishment?

Becky: We started Augustine Literacy Project® with five volunteers. If we weren't necessary and successful with our programs, we would not have been able to attract and keep such consistently loyal donors and tutors-and attract new ones.



Sara: What is your greatest hope for Read Write Spell in 2022 and bevond?

Becky: That it keeps going, and we begin reaching into pre-school.

# CREATING A FOUNDATION FOR SUCCESS

Twenty-twenty-one was a profoundly challenging year for our community, education system, children and families, and Read Write Spell. Unfortunately, for the first half of 2021, we could not work with students in schools, limiting our ability to reach all of our students. In addition, we could not provide any direct support to families. However, because of your investment in Read Write Spell, we could respond to the demands of a changing landscape.

You helped us serve students and educators when they needed us most. We tutored students in our office for the first time, allowing us to create a deeper connection with students and their families. We re-imagined our educator academy program and focused on providing financial support for district literacy leaders and coaches to receive crucial LETRS (Language, Essentials for Teachers of Reading and Spelling) training. We also increased our staff capacity to meet the changing needs of our tutors and programs.

We expanded our volunteer tutoring program by partnering with Project Impact and Winston-Salem/Forsyth County Schools (WS/FCS) to launch the Reading Warriors project. The Reading Warriors project aims to recruit and train an army of tutors to provide literacy support to kindergarten and first-grade struggling readers. I am happy to report that in 2021 we trained 60 1st grade Reading Warrior tutors.

Your support in 2021 allowed us to continue serving students, families, and educators and train more tutors in one year than

we have ever trained in one year before. As I reflect on 2021 and look forward to 2022, I am grateful for the commitment of our volunteers and supporters. I am thankful for the RWS staff who faced challenges with steadfastness and adapted to the new demands of expanding our volunteer tutoring program. I know that we are all united in our commitment to ensure that all children in this community can read and have a foundation for success. I know that we can get there if we continue to work together.



In 2022 we will build on the success of 2021 and learn from the challenges. This year's focus will be to create a strategic plan that will serve as a roadmap for our work over the next three years while allowing flexibility to pivot when necessary. In addition, we will continue to build our Augustine Literacy Project® tutor pool and

> look for new and innovative ways to serve students, families, and educators.

In late 2021, Read Write Spell joined forces with Project Impact and WS/FCS to create the Reading Warriors Project. This collaborative effort is a call to the community to support WS/FCS in closing the achievement gap. Our goal is to build an army of tutors that work with students to help build a strong literacy foundation.



## Supporting Educators Creates Exponential Gains

Teachers are the key to student success. Investing in teacher knowledge is one of the most important ways to create a lasting impact and increase literacy rates in our community. Because of the generous contributions of our supporters, Read Write Spell provided funding for 17 district leaders and coaches to receive LETRS (Language Essentials for Teachers of Reading and Spelling) training. This training will allow them to support Pre-K-5th grade teachers in implementing the science of reading in their classrooms, impacting thousands of children.




